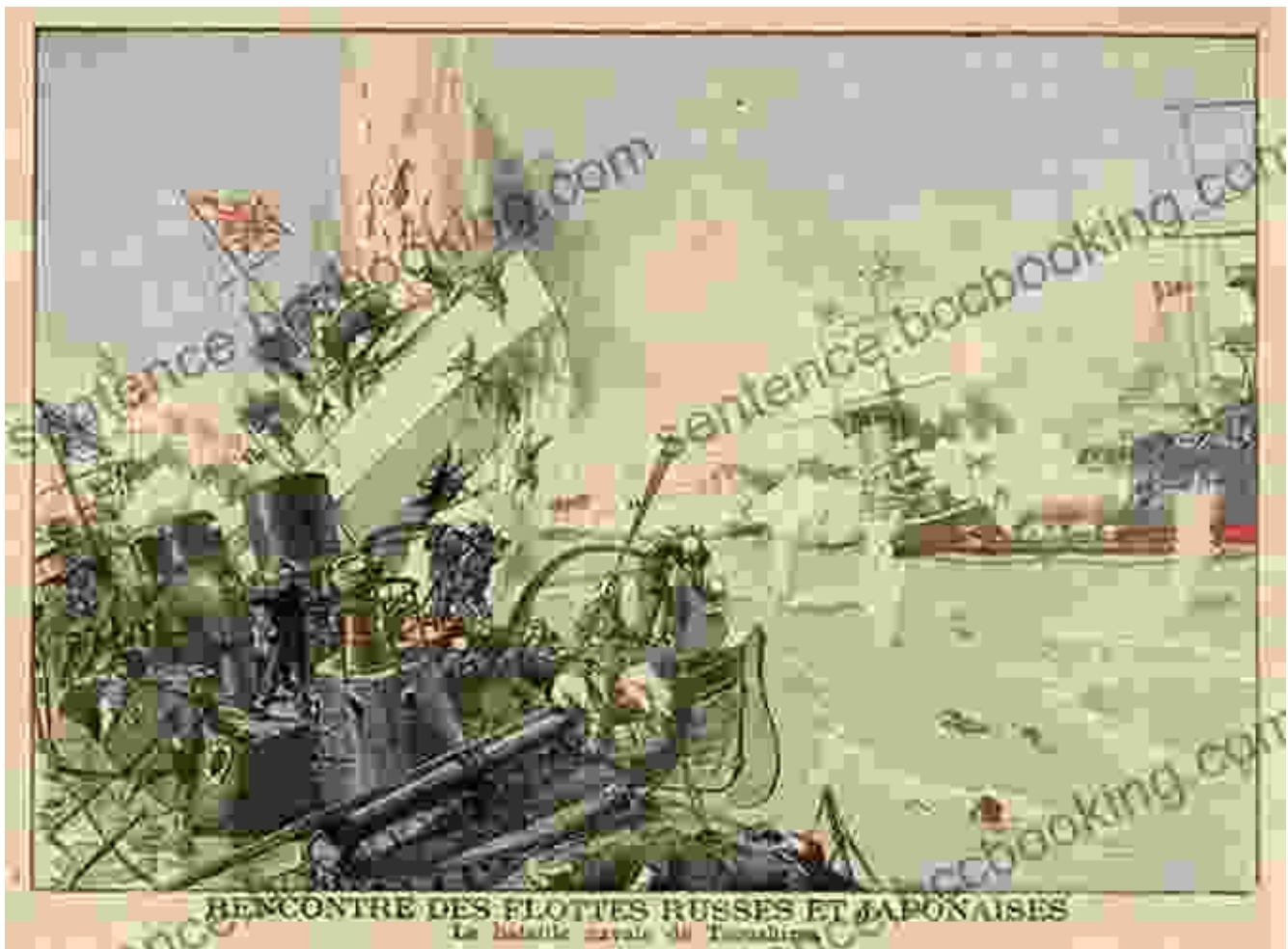


Admiral Togo during the First Sino-Japanese War

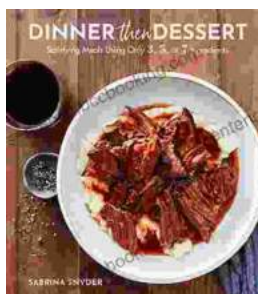

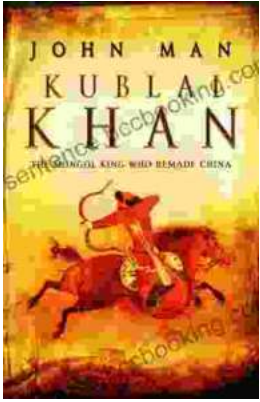
