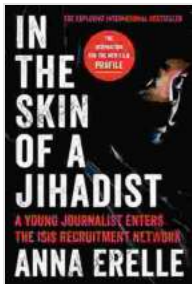


# Young Journalist Enters the ISIS Recruitment Network

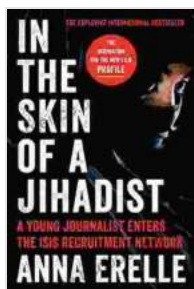
